
A discussion was led by Robert Briseno regarding the future of the Dictionary Project.

A representative from VCUSD has expressed their gratitude for Rotary's involvement. They also explained the school district's current goals. Their biggest challenge is to reduce the dropout rate, which is reportedly approaching 50%.

Starting with elementary-age students, the district is creating "hands-on learning labs" in conjunction with Cal Berkeley. These labs help children see how math and science are involved in building different items and structures such as roller coasters.
