## Program

JD Miller introduced our guest Victor Gauthier, the Tour Manager with the Toll Bridge Program Oversight Committee. This is part of the Bay Bridge Public Information Office.

The new span west of Yerba Buena island was completed in 2004. It looks the same, but they added 75 years of life to that span of the bridge

If the bridge needs to close, it will usually happen during Labor Day Weekend, as this is historically the lightest traffic the bridge has

The eastern span of the bridge is the largest, longest and widest self anchor suspension span in the world!!!

SAS is all steel bridge. Orthaburbagor... OBGs.

The leak that was reported on in the new span was very minimal. The OBG was coated with zinc apoxy, which keeps things from rusting

Lightest deck was 500 tons and the heaviest deck was 1700 tons

DK ultimately got it as "the bottom of the sea." There are some Rotarians that need to watch Pirate's of the Caribbean! Maybe DK can talk his wife into hosting a movie night...

Jacking saddle: great name for a piece of the bridge.

The Bay Bridge has it's own color: Bay Bridge White

The piles go 300 feet down below the Bay

75% of the steel in the bridge was domestic, only 25% was foreign

The rights for the steel belong to the contractor. It has lead and asbestos in it, so it gets tricky for "easy" re-use

It will take 3-5 years to take down the entirety of the old span
