Kurt graduated from SSC and went on to get his BA at Cal Poly San Luis Obispo. He went on to have a 30 year career in municipal planning and economic development with 22 years of it in Fairfield working on

Kurt now is the SSC Education Foundation Director and works passionately to create the positive perception in the community. They have raised enough \$ to start a branding and imaging campaign, along with creating a marketing strategy approach. In a 2012 study, it showed that the great American working class is shrinking. Family income has declined 7% since 2000. Half of Americans are in some sort of poverty and the American Dream is at risk.

In 2018 62% of jobs will require some sort of post high school education. In the last recession it was the workers with high school education only that were first laid off. Community Colleges produce over 2 million graduates compared to the entire UC undergraduate which only produce a few hundred thousand.

Community Colleges tuition is 1/10 of the UC system. CC funding is 78% less per student, compared to the UC systems and even much less compared to the K thru 12.

SSC is 19,000 students strong. Majority of students are female and the average age is 30 years old. Hispanic population is growing. 8100 students are on financial aid and do not pay any tuition at all. Kurt raises a lot of money for these families that qualify for the aid. Solano College has expanded to Vacaville and Fairfield and Dixon and Winters because SSC students like to have a school close to them. SSC has the highest graduate completion compared to neighboring CC's. SCC have a 5% graduate level.
